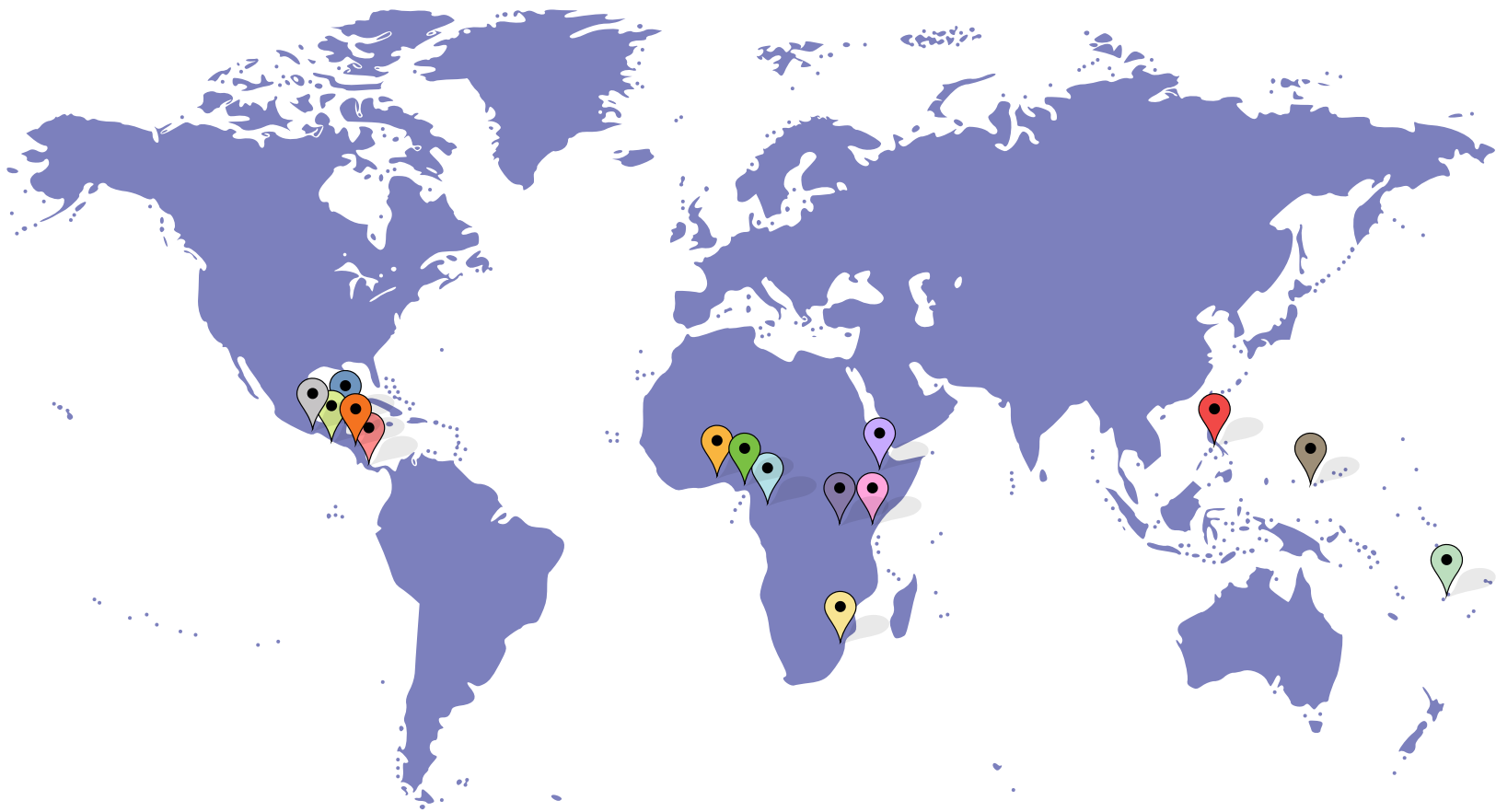

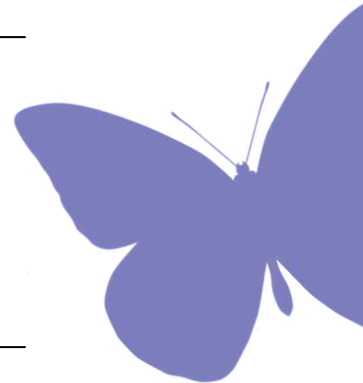

"In-kind donations" refer to a form of charitable giving where medical goods and services are gifted instead of monetary donations. Mending Kids receives a substantial number of such donations annually in the form of service hours from medical professionals, free or discounted surgical supplies and equipment, facility rental fee reductions, and valuable items and experiences that are auctioned off at our events.

The above financial information is based on our unaudited interim financial statements as we are undergoing our 2023 annual independent audit.



Building Sustainable Healthcare Partnerships

In our ongoing commitment to fostering self-reliance and sustainable healthcare solutions in Tanzania, our overseas programs have taken an innovative turn. Since 2015, we have dedicated our efforts to supporting cardiac programs in Tanzania, collaborating closely with the Jakaya Kikwete Cardiac Center. A pivotal development in this journey has been the integration of members from the Center's ICU into our missions. By inviting their intensivist and two ICU nurses to join our teams, we've not only expanded our expertise but also set a precedent for collaboration and knowledge exchange. Their presence serves as a living testament to the transformative power of partnership and shared learning. Moreover, they now serve as guiding lights for our endeavors in emerging programs like Mauritius. Their journey exemplifies the potential unleashed when collective efforts, hands-on exchanges, and safety nets converge to elevate skills, enhance patient care, and build resilient healthcare systems. Together, we are paving the way for a brighter and healthier future, one mission at a time.

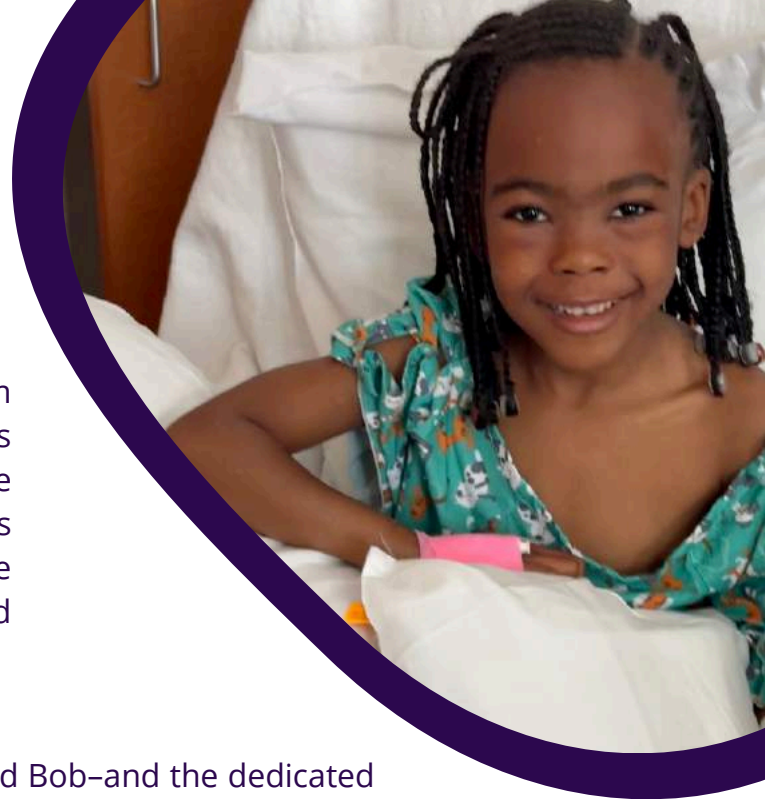


Regional Missions Philippines

Mending Kids partnered with the Philippine Heart Center for two regional missions in the Philippines in 2023. These missions took us to Tacloban City, where Dr. Jean Villareal served as the lead surgeon, and Zamboanga City, where Dr. Alex Chen led the first cardiovascular surgical mission. Through these missions, we aimed to enhance the standard of care and provide cardiovascular treatment to children who lacked access to it and might not afford the journey to the capital of Manila for specialized care. In total, we successfully treated 27 children in 2023.

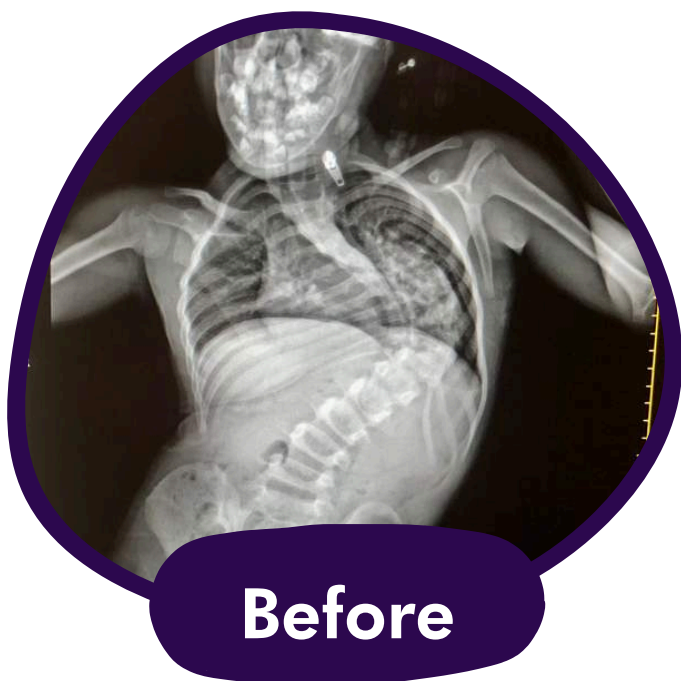
Elise

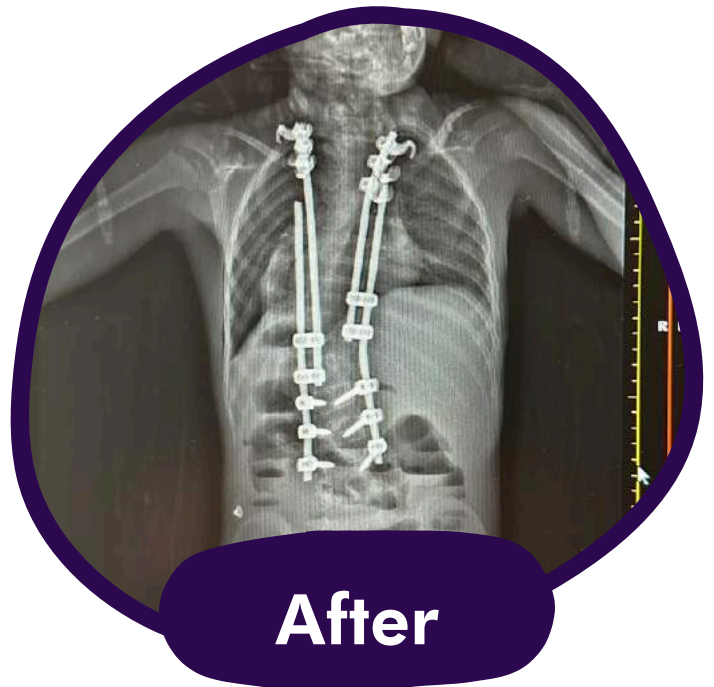

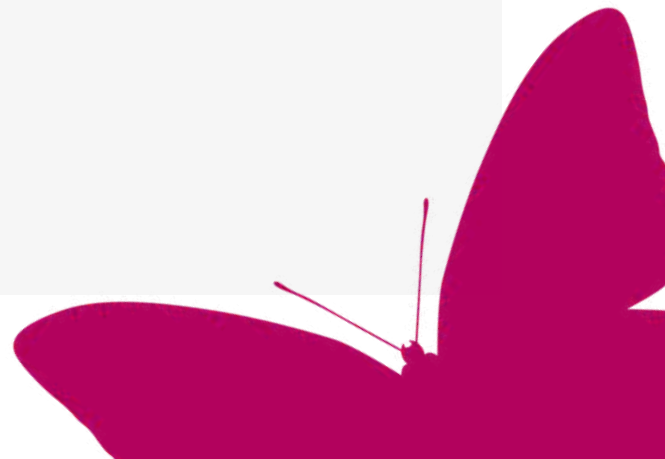
